## EDUCATION - \$1,049,780

### **Arc of the Glades Inc.**

To replace the roof at the main facility, which provides a space to partner with people living with developmental disabilities for equal participation and inclusion in the communities of western Palm Beach County.

For the Youth Aboard Mobile Club, a state-of-the-art mobile classroom designed to extend learning and resources into local communities to serve not only those who are Club members, but all Martin County youth and families, leveling the playing field and creating equal opportunities for all.

To complete essential facility upgrades to maximize safety for members, families, staff and guests.

### **Connections Education Center of the Palm Beaches, Inc.**

For technology to improve skills and decrease challenging behaviors for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

For impact windows to improve the safety and security for the childcare center.

This request provided the support for 211 to obtain virtual meeting equipment, an intercom system, and battery backups, as well as to purchase and install security cameras to ensure the safety of staff when they are working on-site connecting people in crisis to mental health and wellness services.

## HOMELESSNESS - \$651,841

### **Adopt-A-Family of the Palm Beaches, Inc.**

For updated air-conditioning units to improve the quality of affordable housing stock for homeless families.

For renovations at the emergency shelter and transitional housing apartments for victims of domestic abuse.
